Our Seventh Green Schools Flag - Global Citizenship - Marine Environment

We are currently working on our seventh 'Green School flag for Global Citizenship – Marine Environment.' The children in Ms Faughnan's Class have been working on a special project called 'Picker Pals'.

Picker Pals is a new initiative being run by Voice Ireland, a nationwide environmental NGO and Fingal County Council that develops children's awareness and community responsibility around the issue of litter. It helps them to understand how they can make positive changes in their own neighbourhood. The children take home a litter picker and use it to collect litter and plastic waste. 

Implementation of the School's Covid Response


Plan: An Inspector visited the school on 27th November 2020 to complete an assessment of the Covid response plan. The report Supporting the Safe Provision of Schooling (SSPS) assesses the safe and sustainable working environment to support the ongoing provision of schooling. The checks are grouped into 4 main areas: 1) planning 2) appointment of a Lead Worker Representative (LWR) 3) provision of staff training and 4) implementation of control measures. The inspector determined that the school was fully compliant in each of these areas which is a great comfort to all in the school community.

School Improvements and Maintenance: There have been a number of small but significant ongoing improvements in the school: hot water to all toilets, paper towel dispensers, roof repairs and new windows. The purchase of a new front door, new yard markings as well as the refurbishment of the school hall is planned for the new year. An application has also been submitted to the DES under Emergency Works to upgrade the fire alarm and install emergency and LED lighting throughout the school. The school website has also been updated with lots of news about the school and has regular COVID updates. The Parents' Association continues to play such an important role in the school and have recently welcomed new members. The Board of Management would like to acknowledge their support to the school since opening last August.

Child Protection: The Child Safeguarding Statement and Risk Assessment are displayed inside the school in the reception area and have been posted on the school website. These were reviewed by the Board of Management in September. Lorna Lavin is the Designated Liaison Person and Andrea Smith the Deputy Designated Liaison Person. Teachers are made aware on a regular basis of their responsibilities as Mandated Persons. Catherine Treacy, the school Inspector, has completed a Child Protection Level 1 inspection and the school is fully compliant. I would like to wish, on behalf of the BOM, a healthy and happy Christmas and New Year to all staff, children and their families.


On Thursday there were a few elves doing the rounds in school helping Santa Claus while he visited the boys and girls in the school.
