## A Word from the Chairperson...

Another school term comes to a close and as the school prepares for another festive season we would like to welcome all new children, and their parents, to the school community. We are very pleased to say that the pupil teacher ratio will continue to improve next year. As announced in the Budget, the PTR will be 26:1. This improvement is very good news.

We are again fortunate that the Department of Education and Skills sanctioned the Minor Works grant. This money will be used to fund school repairs and contribute towards IT maintenance and upgrade. St Helen's Junior has also been sanctioned funding for a prefab which will be used as resource teaching rooms and as a much needed library for the children. The Fingal Network Initiative had yet another very successful Golf Classic and donated €3,300 to the Cabhair Centre. A new shed is to be installed and bikes and other occupational therapy equipment will be purchased for the children.

WiFi was installed in the school over the summer and this will be used by all staff in the classrooms and will contribute significantly to the teaching facilities in the school.

The school also welcomes the reinstatement of In-School Management Posts. This is not a full reinstatement of the posts that were lost during the recession but it is a start and will contribute to the management of the school.

On behalf of the Board of Management I would like to thank our Principal, Miriam Dowdall, and all staff in the school for their continued good work. May we take this opportunity to wish you all a very Happy and Peaceful Christmas.
