Once again your response to the Voluntary Donation was magnificent. The Board thanks you for your generosity in what are still difficult financial times for every family. The Board relies to a great extent on this source of income to maintain the school's excellent educational facilities.

The Board welcomes the decision of the Department of Education and Skills to pay the Minor Works grant again this year. This grant of  $\in 12,000$  is used to cover minor structural repairs and furnishing.

The Board extends its sympathies to the family of Brendan Hennigan, RIP, who died suddenly on 21st November. Some of you will remember Brendan, first as a teacher then as Deputy Principal and finally as principal of St Helen's Junior School, for a number of years before moving to a Special School in 2003.
